

History of Ranger Category

"Ranger"

Back in 2019, the Cascade Ghostriders created a new category to honor both traditional and modern law enforcement: the Ranger category. This opened the door for shooters to use a wider range of firearms, from classic Old West models to contemporary tools of the trade. We invite SASS cowboys and competitors from other shooting disciplines to dress as Texas Rangers and join the fun, competing with period-appropriate or modern firearms. Newer shooters are especially welcome to come play our favorite game!

The Ranger category is here to stay! You can shoot monthly matches or this annual SASS event (using "Wild Bunch" style rules) and step into the boots of your favorite law enforcement figure.

But that's not all! When the pandemic made it tough to find reloading supplies, we introduced the "Cadet" category. Honoring recruits and officers in training, Cadets can use a combination of .22 rimfire firearms – think of it as an adult Buckaroo with modern .22s.

After the huge success of our first Ranger Roundup in October 2022, we brought it back in 2023 and 2024. Now, we're proud to present our 2025 one-day annual event: Ranger Roundup IV!



Ranger Categories

- Vintage SASS approved guns and gear such as; single action pistols, double
 or 1897 pump shotgun, and pistol caliber lever rifle. Duelist, Gunfighter,
 Frontier Cartridge, and Age and Gender are not recognized in separate
 categories.
- Traditional Double action revolver with speed loaders, (2) double action revolvers, or 1911 style pistol (steel frame, exposed hammer, not striker fired or polymer), any pump shotgun or vintage semi-auto shotgun i.e., Browning Auto, and any lever-action or semi-auto rifle other than AR-15 or AK-47 format (Ruger PC Carbine is acceptable). Vintage firearms may be used for rifle or shotgun. Duelist, Gunfighter, Frontier Cartridge, and Age and Gender are not recognized in separate categories.
- Modern Modern military, LE, or civilian style rifle such as AR-15,
 Kalashnikov, or bull-pup pistol caliber carbine. Modern semi-auto shotgun
 such as Mossberg, Stoeger, Benelli, or Berretta. Semi-auto striker fired,
 double action, polymer or steel. Use of any optic. Any Vintage or Traditional
 long-gun may be used in this category. Duelist, Gunfighter, Frontier
 Cartridge, and Age and Gender are not recognized in separate categories.
- Cadet Any use of a rim fire rifle or pistol (with or without optic). Shotgun
 must be used in this category (any style). Duelist, Gunfighter, Frontier
 Cartridge, and Age and Gender are not recognized in separate categories.
- Wanted Any pistol caliber Rifle/Shotgun/ and Pistol(s) combination. Any shooting style, optic or not. Must represent an outlaw persona. Duelist, Gunfighter, Frontier Cartridge, and Age and Gender are not recognized in separate categories.

Rules of Engagement

- 1) SASS Rules are in play unless an addendum or alteration is specifically announced by the Match Director.
- 2) At the start of the stage All firearms are held, staged, or holstered with actions closed on an empty chamber or cylinder.
- 3) Magazines may be loaded with any number or rounds.
- 4) All guns are returned to a safe position and empty.
- 5) Extra rounds may be shot into the berm or manually ejected after immediate engagement.
- 6) Firearms shot last with extra rounds remaining may be unloaded at the end of the stage as a part of the Range Officer's clearing and reholstering instructions.
- 7) Knockdown targets may be reengaged until down.
- 8) All pistols will require one reload or the use of a second pistol in Vintage and Wanted categories.
- 9) Cadet Category Rimfire pistols may be empty and without magazine in the gun at the start of the stage. A single insertion of one loaded magazine may be initiated after the draw and count as a pistol reload.
- 10) All determinations for procedurals and penalty assessments will be made in the spirit of the SASS handbook and under the guidance of the Match Director and his Range Officers. We will try not to make stuff up!

Stage #1 Bay #1



No badge they wore, nor uniform bright,
Just grit and guns in fading light.
Austin's men, a watchful band,
Protecting dreams in Texas land.
Against the raid, the arrow's flight,
They stood their ground, with all their might.
A frontier's hope, a colony's plea,
The Rangers born, for Texas free.



Unofficial Beginnings (1823)

Early Days - 1

Stephen F. Austin, considered the "Father of Texas," first employed a small group of men to protect his colony from Native American raids and other threats. These men were the precursors to the modern Rangers.

Shooter needs: 10 Rifle, 10 Pistol, As Needed Shotgun.

Shooter starts: Standing behind the barrel with one hand on the saddle horn and holding the rifle with the other hand level with the ground. Shotgun is staged on a table. Pistols are holstered.

Shooter says: "They stood their ground, with all their might."


Rifle – Triple-tap the outside Bandits, then double-tap the inside bandits. Make rifle safe on the table.

Shotgun – From the table engage fallers until down.

Pistols – Move to an arm's reach of the fault line and re-engage the Bandits with same instructions as rifle.

Formal Establishment (1835)

Early Days - 2

The Texas Rangers were officially established by the Texas provisional government during the Texas Revolution. Their primary role was to patrol the frontier and defend against Native American attacks.

Shooter needs: 10 Rifle, 10 Pistol, As Needed Shotgun.

Shooter starts: Standing in rifle box with rifle in hand. Shotgun is staged on a table. Pistols are holstered.

Shooter says: "Against the foe, they bravely fought".


Rifle: – Move to up range horse and engage cowboys from left side of horse with three sweeps for nine and placing the tenth round on any cowboy at any time. Move to table and make rifle safe.

Shotgun: Engage all poppers until down.

Pistols: - From anywhere between table and fence, engage cowboys with same instructions as rifle.

Frontier Defense

Republic of Texas and Early Statehood -1

The Rangers played a crucial role in protecting settlers and fighting Native American tribes during the Republic of Texas era and after Texas joined the United States. They were known for their toughness, resourcefulness, and skill in combat.

Shooter needs: 10 Rifle, 10 Pistol, As Needed Shotgun.

Shooter starts: Standing in the Rifle box with rifle in hand. Shotgun staged on wagon. Pistols holstered.

Shooter says: "On Texas' soil, they bravely roam."


Rifle – Engage (2) tombstones with two each, then one on the cowboy, then two each on the other two tombstones, then one on the cowboy. Make rifle safe on the wagon.

Shotgun – From wagon knock down the poppers, then from horse knock down the pipes. Make shotgun safe on horse.

Pistols – From horse, engage targets with same instructions as Rifle.

Stage #4 Bay #2

Border Security

Republic of Texas and Early Statehood -2

The Rangers also patrolled the border with Mexico, dealing with bandits, cattle rustlers, and other outlaws.

Shooter needs: 10 Rifle, 10 Pistol, As Needed Shotgun.

Shooter starts: Standing in rifle box with rifle in hand. Shotgun staged on wagon.

Shooter says: "No line defined, no border clear..."


Rifle – Engage the bandits and circle as follows: Tripple-tap the circle, then single-tap the bandits, then triple-tap the circle. Make rifle safe on horse.

Pistols – From horse, engage targets with same instructions as rifle.

Shotgun – Move to wagon and engage the (4) fallers until down. **Semi-auto pistols and DA** revolvers loaded with six must be downed open and empty on wagon.

Law and Order

Late 19th and Early 20th Centuries - 1

As Texas became more settled, the Rangers' focus shifted towards general law enforcement. They tracked down criminals, investigated crimes, and maintained order in a vast and often lawless territory.

Shooter needs: 10 Rifle, 10 Pistol, As Needed Shotgun.

Shooter starts: Standing at the up-range barrel with hands hovering over Rifle staged on top of barrel. Shotgun staged on table and pistols holstered.

Shooter says: "In Texas' name, they prove their worth."


Rifle – From barrel, engage the circles and coffins as follows: Sweep the circles, then sweep the coffins, then sweep the circles. Make rifle safe on table.

Shotgun – From window, engage the (4) snakes until off of their plate. Make shotgun safe.

Pistols – From fence re-engage the targets with the same instructions as Rifle.

Controversies

Late 19th and Early 20th Centuries - 2

The Rangers' history is not without controversy. They were sometimes accused of excessive force and involvement in questionable actions, particularly against Mexican Americans.

Shooter needs: 10 Rifle, 10 Pistol, As Needed Shotgun.

Shooter starts: Standing one foot in Rifle box. Shotgun staged on horse and pistols holstered.

Shooter says: "No simple tale, no hero's crown..."

Rifle – Shooter's choice of small circles or large. Engage with a double-tap Nevada Sweep. Make safe on horse.

Pistols – If rifle engaged small circles, then engage large circles from horse with a double-tap Nevada Sweep. If rifle engaged large circles, move to fence and engage small circles with same instructions.

Shotgun - Engage (4) fallers from horse until down. Make safe on table if pistols are last.

(Pistol/Shotgun order dependent on the order of rifle target engagement.)


